

## Notify the Completion of a Print Job WordPerfect Magazine

Using a system variable, you can create a simple macro to have WordPerfect notify you when it has finished sending a print job. This is especially useful if you have a large print job that will take several minutes to print and you need to know as soon as it's finished.

The macro is included as PRNTBEEP.WPM. Be sure to place it in the directory that contains your macros.

To run the macro, first print the document as you normally would, using Print (Shift-F7). After you send the print job, press Macro (Alt-F10), type "prntbeep" and press (Enter). The macro waits until the print job has finished, then beeps.

*Note: If the file is small, WordPerfect may finish printing the file before you have a chance to run the macro. In this case the bell sounds as soon as you run the macro.*

*The macro could be written to print the document as well (to eliminate the time gap between printing the document and running the macro), but this would prohibit you from choosing specific print options in the print menu, such as printing multiple pages or changing the graphics quality.*
