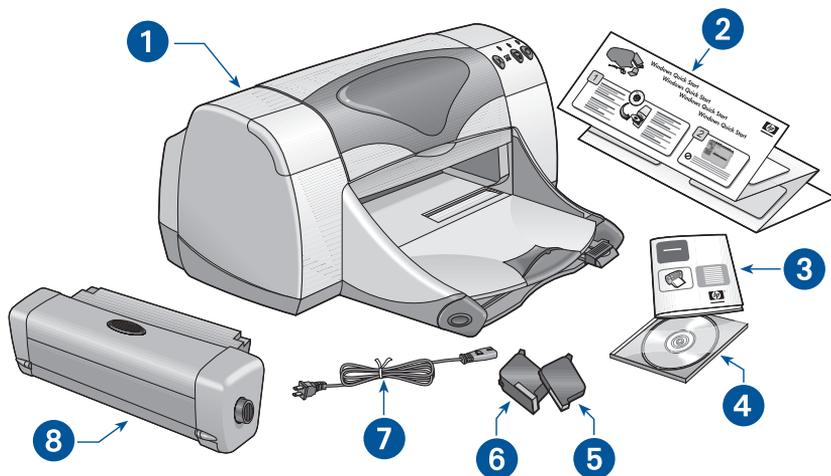
# introducing the hp deskjet printer

## what's in the box

Thank you for buying an HP Deskjet printer! Your printer box contains the following items:

- HP Deskjet printer (990c series, 980c series, or 960c series)
- Automatic two-sided printing module (may not be available in all printer models)
- Power cord
- Printer software CD
- *quick reference guide*
- *quick start poster*
- Black print cartridge
- Tri-color print cartridge

If any of these items is missing from your box, talk to your HP dealer or contact HP customer care. See "contacting hp customer care" for more information.



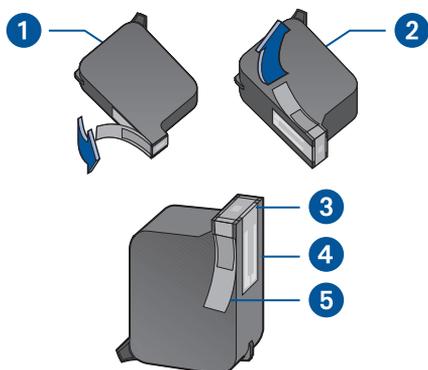

## print cartridges

The HP Deskjet printer box includes both a black and a color print cartridge. Each print cartridge box, and the electronic *quick help* manual, contain installation instructions.

When you replace a print cartridge, verify that you have the correct part number:

- Black—hp 45 (hp 516**45a**)
- Tri-color—hp 78 (hp c65**78d**)
- Large Tri-color—hp 78 (hp c65**78a**)



1. black print cartridge 2. tri-color print cartridge 3. ink nozzles 4. copper contacts 5. protective vinyl tape

**Caution!** When you replace a print cartridge, do not touch the print cartridge ink nozzles or copper contacts. Touching these parts will result in clogs, ink failure, and bad electrical connections. In addition, do not remove the copper strips. They are required electrical contacts.

## printer cables

A printer cable is not included in the box. Purchase one of the following cables to connect the printer to your computer:

- An IEEE 1284-compliant parallel interface cable which is used with all Windows systems
- A USB-compliant interface cable which is used with both Macintosh systems and Windows 98, Me, and 2000 systems

## software updates

Printer software, also called the printer driver, communicates your print requests to the printer. Use either of the following methods to obtain copies and updates of the printer software:

- Download the printer software from HP's Website.
- Phone HP customer care to request a CD containing the software update files.

See "contacting hp customer care" for customer care telephone numbers and Website addresses.

# viewing quick help

The electronic manual, *quick help*, offers instructions for using the HP Deskjet printer. Information is also provided to help you solve printer problems that may occur.

## Windows 95, 98, Me, 2000, and NT 4.0 users

Open *quick help* through the hp printer assistant, a tool that also provides:

- Support through HP's customer care
- Printing ideas
- Shopping links to other HP products
- Links to printer software updates

A printer assistant icon is displayed on the Windows desktop after you install the printer software.

### accessing *quick help*

To view *quick help*:

1. Double-click the **hp printer assistant** icon on your computer desktop.

The hp printer assistant appears.

2. Click the **quick help** button to display the manual's topics.

You can also open *quick help* from the Start menu by clicking **Start > Programs > hp deskjet 9xx series > 9xx printer assistant > quick help**.

## Adobe Acrobat versions of *quick help*

The *quick help* manual is also available in the following languages:

If you want to view the manual in one of these languages:

1. Double-click the **hp printer assistant** icon on your computer desktop.
2. Click the **quick help** button in the hp printer assistant screen.
3. Select **quick help is available in other languages** at the bottom of the *quick help* screen.
4. Insert the printer software CD into the computer's CD-ROM drive.
5. Select your language from the list that appears.
  - If Acrobat Reader is installed on your computer, *quick help* is displayed.
  - If Acrobat Reader is not installed on your computer, it installs automatically. *quick help* is then displayed.

## Macintosh users

On Macintosh computers, Adobe Acrobat Reader is required to view the *quick help* manual. If you do not have Acrobat Reader, install it from the printer software CD.

To open *quick help*:

1. Insert the printer software CD into the computer's CD-ROM drive.  
The hp deskjet screen is displayed.
2. Select the **User Manual** folder for your language.
3. Do one of the following:
  - Double-click the **Electronic User Manual** icon if Acrobat Reader is installed on your computer.

- Double-click the **Acrobat Reader 4.0** icon if Acrobat Reader is not installed on your computer.

Adobe Acrobat Reader installs automatically. After it is installed, double-click the **Electronic User Manual** icon to display *quick help*.

# viewing printer information in Windows 3.1x and DOS

## Windows 3.1x users

In Windows 3.1x systems, information about operating the printer is located in an electronic *User's Guide*. This option is available only with HP Deskjet 990c series printers.

You need Adobe Acrobat Reader to view the *User's Guide*. If you do not have Acrobat Reader, install it from the printer software CD when you view the guide for the first time.

To open the *User's Guide*:

1. Insert the printer software CD into the computer's CD-ROM drive.
2. Select **File > Run** in the Program Manager.
3. Type **d:\setup.exe**.  
Substitute the letter of your CD-ROM drive for "d" if necessary.
4. Click **OK**.

The hp deskjet screen is displayed.

5. Select **View User's Guide**.
  - If Acrobat Reader is installed on your computer, the *User's Guide* is displayed.
  - If Acrobat Reader is not installed on your computer, follow the onscreen installation instructions. Once Acrobat Reader is installed, select **View User's Guide** to display the manual.

## DOS users

In DOS operating systems, information about the HP Deskjet printer is found in a text document called *dosread.txt*. This file is located on the printer software CD in the `\<language code>\djcp\` directory. For `<language code>` substitute the relevant code from the list below. To read the file in English, for example, open *dosread.txt* in the `\enu\djcp` directory.

### hp user community forums

If you cannot solve the problem using these resources, call an HP customer care service technician while you are in front of your computer and printer. For faster service, please be prepared to provide information about the steps you have taken to solve the problem.

In addition, HP needs the following information to assist you:

- The printer's model number (the label is on the front of the printer)
- The printer's serial number (the label is on the bottom of the printer)
- The computer's operating system
- The version of the printer driver (also referred to as the printer software)
- Messages displayed around the time the situation occurred
- Answers to these questions:
  - Has this situation happened before? Can you re-create it?
  - When did this happen? Did you add any new hardware or software around the time this situation began?

## support phone numbers

## obtaining hp customer care repair

If your HP printer needs repairing, call HP customer care phone support. (See HP's support phone numbers on the previous page.) A trained HP customer care service technician will diagnose the problem and coordinate the repair process.

Customer care will direct you to the best solution, whether it is an authorized service provider or an HP facility. This service is free during your printer's limited warranty period. After the warranty period, you will be quoted a repair cost.

## obtaining a warranty extension

If you would like to extend your warranty coverage beyond the limited warranty period, the following options are available:

- Consult your reseller to get extended coverage. To find HP resellers in the U.S., visit HP's service locator at [www.hp.com/service\\_locator](http://www.hp.com/service_locator).
- If your reseller does not offer service contracts, call HP directly and ask about our HP service agreements. In the U.S. call (800) 446-0522; in Canada call (800) 268-1221. For HP service agreements outside of the U.S. and Canada, contact your local HP sales office.

# solving Windows installation problems

View the information in this section if you have problems setting up your printer. If you need help after the printer is set up, see the *quick help* electronic manual.

## what is the problem?

I inserted the installation CD, but the computer could not read it.



## possible causes...

- The CD is not properly inserted in the CD-ROM drive
- The CD is damaged
- The CD-ROM is damaged



## to solve the problem...

Reinsert the CD into the CD-ROM drive. Be careful to position the CD correctly. If installation does not begin after a few seconds, either the CD or CD-ROM drive may be damaged.



Insert a different CD in the CD-ROM drive. If another CD works, you may have a damaged CD. If you are not able to play any CD, you may need to replace or repair your CD-ROM drive.



Replace the damaged CD by downloading the printer software (also known as the printer driver) from the HP Website. If you do not have Web access, contact HP customer care to order the software on CD. For the phone number of the HP customer care center nearest to you, see "contacting hp customer care".

## what is the problem?

The printer software did not install correctly.



## possible causes...

- There may be a conflict with your virus protection program
- There may be a conflict with another software program
- There may be a conflict with a peripheral device connected to your printer



## to solve the problem...

Uninstall your printer software.



### For Windows 95, 98, Me, NT 4.0, and 2000:

1. Click **Start > Programs > hp deskjet 9xx series > hp deskjet 9xx series uninstall**.
2. Follow the directions that appear on your computer screen.



### For Windows 3.1x:

1. Open the **hp deskjet 9xx series** program group.
2. Double-click the hp deskjet 9xx series **Uninstall** icon.
3. Follow the instructions that appear on your computer screen.



- Close any software programs (including virus protection programs) that are running.
- Disconnect any peripheral devices that use a parallel printer cable (such as a scanner or tape backup system).



Reinstall the printer software. See the *quick start* poster.



If you are still having problems with the software installation, contact HP customer care. See "contacting hp customer care".

## what is the problem?

When I connect a USB cable between the printer and my computer, the New Hardware Wizard does not appear.



### possible causes...

You may not be using Windows 98, Me, or 2000.



Make sure Windows 98, Me, or 2000 is running. If you do not have Windows 98, Me, or 2000, you need to use a parallel cable.

Your USB cable may not be connected properly.



1. Disconnect and then reconnect the USB cable from your printer.
2. Make sure that the cable is securely attached.

Your computer may not be USB enabled.



- In Windows 98, Me, or 2000:**
1. Click **Start > Settings > Control Panel**.
  2. Double-click the **System** icon.
  3. Select the **Device Manager** tab.
  4. Click the plus (+) icon next to the Universal Serial Bus Controller option.
    - If you see a USB host controller and a USB root hub listed, USB is probably enabled.
    - If you do not see these devices listed, refer to your computer's documentation or contact the computer's manufacturer for more information on enabling and setting up USB.
  5. Use a parallel cable to connect the printer to your computer if you cannot enable USB.

## what is the problem?

When I connect a USB cable between the printer and my computer, an "Unknown Device" message appears.



## possible causes...

- Static electricity has built up in the cable between the printer and your computer
- You may have a defective USB cable



## to solve the problem...

1. Disconnect the USB cable from the printer.
2. Unplug the printer from its power cord.
3. Wait approximately 30 seconds.
4. Plug the printer cord into the printer.
5. Plug the USB cable into the printer.
6. Replace the USB cable or use a parallel cable if "Unknown Device" continues to appear in the New Hardware Found dialog box.

## what is the problem?

When I insert the printer software CD and the files start to copy, the Copying Files... screen says that file **hpzuci01.dll** cannot be found.



## possible causes...

All the following conditions are present:

- You are using a USB cable to connect the printer to your computer
- You are using Windows 98
- You are connecting more than one device at the same time



## to solve the problem...

1. Click **Browse**.  
The Open screen is displayed.
2. Select the following path to locate the *hpzuci01.dll* file: **c:\Program Files\Hewlett-Packard\hpz\ glue**.
3. Click **OK**.  
The Copying Files... screen reappears with the correct path and file name inserted in the Copy files from... field.
4. Click **OK**.
5. Select **Install hp deskjet 9xx series printer software**.  
The hp deskjet 9xx installer screen appears.
6. Click **Next**, then follow the onscreen instructions to complete installation.

## limited warranty statement

### A. extent of limited warranty

1. Hewlett-Packard (HP) warrants to the end-user customer that the HP products specified above will be free from defects in materials and workmanship for the duration specified above, which duration begins on the date of purchase by the customer. Customer is responsible for maintaining proof of date of purchase.
2. For software products, HP's limited warranty applies only to a failure to execute programming instructions. HP does not warrant that the operation of any product will be uninterrupted or error free.
3. HP's limited warranty covers only those defects which arise as a result of normal use of the product, and do not apply to any:
  - a. Improper or inadequate maintenance or modification;
  - b. Software, interfacing, media, parts, or supplies not provided or supported by HP; or
  - c. Operation outside the product's specifications.
4. For HP printer products, the use of a non-HP ink cartridge or a refilled ink cartridge does not affect either the warranty to the customer or any HP support contract with the customer. However, if printer failure or damage is attributable to the use of a non-HP or refilled ink cartridge, HP will charge its standard time and materials charges to service the printer for the particular failure or damage.
5. If HP receives, during the applicable warranty period, notice of a defect in any software, media, or ink cartridge covered by HP's warranty, HP shall replace the defective product. If HP receives notice of a defect in any hardware product covered by HP's warranty during the applicable warranty period, HP shall either repair or replace the defective product at HP's option.
6. If HP is unable to repair or replace, as applicable, a defective product covered by HP's warranty, HP shall, within a reasonable time after being notified of the defect, refund the purchase price of the product.
7. HP shall have no obligation to repair, replace, or refund until the customer returns the defective product to HP.
8. Any replacement product may be either new or like-new, provided that it has functionality at least equal to that of the product being replaced.
9. HP's limited warranty is valid in any country where the covered HP product is distributed by HP except for the Middle-East, Africa, Argentina, Brazil, Mexico, Venezuela, and France's "Departements D'Outre-Mer"; for those excepted areas, the warranty is valid only in the country of purchase. Contracts for additional warranty services, such as on-site service, may be available from any authorized HP service facility where the product is distributed by HP or by an authorized importer.

**B. limitations of warranty**

1.
