Product overview

IBM® InfoSphere™ Warehouse extends DB2® Enterprise with data warehousing and analytics inside the data server.

1 Step 1: Access your software


2 Step 2: Evaluate your hardware and system configuration

3 Step 3: Review the base architecture

InfoSphere Warehouse is a distributed product and its components are arranged into three logical groups, as shown in this diagram:



4 Step 4: Read the InfoSphere Warehouse Installation Guide

5 Step 5: Install the data warehouse server



This group includes DB2 Enterprise Server Edition, DB2 Query Patroller, the Cubing Services stored procedure, and Data Mining (Intelligent Miner™).

6 Step 6: Install the application server



This group includes WebSphere® Application Server, the InfoSphere Warehouse administration console, the SQL Warehousing Tool runtime, Cubing Services, Unstructured Analytics Runtime, and Alphablox and Miningblox. The InfoSphere Warehouse administration console requires either DB2 Enterprise or the IBM Data Server Client to be installed for this group. If you do not install DB2 Enterprise then the Data Server Client is installed.

7 Step 7: Install the client



This group includes the Design Studio, the Data Server Client, Query Patroller center, and Intelligent Miner Visualization.

8 Step 8: Install the documentation



You can install the documentation, including the InfoSphere Warehouse Tutorial and samples, on any Windows® or Linux® computer in your environment.

9 Step 9: Configure your environment



After running the installation program, you need to perform a few tasks to get InfoSphere Warehouse up and running. See the Installation Guide for more information.
